**As we approach the end of this year, we will soon enter the next! But this coming year I believe will finally be the beginning of huge changes which most of us are not, but can, get ready for.**



If this book speaks to you or uncovers a raw nerve or challenges you in an essential way to change or take some action, there are several immediate things you can do.

➤ 1. Remember that it is God who is the power. We are really weak but get your eyes off your own weakness and lack of whatever is discouraging you, and trust in the great Almighty God to help you in this new life with Jesus you are going to have after reading

and assimilating this book. God resists the proud, but He will definitely give grace to the humble. James 4:6,7 says:

*But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble. Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.*

➤ 2. Pray for the young people of Britain (your country), that God will raise up the next generation of Christian leaders and that they will really, deeply know Jesus and the Word of God, and that they will be fearless, and able to provide clear and powerful leadership for their generations. These could be young people who are Christians already or even those not yet born into the Kingdom.

It unfortunately seems that many churches from the traditional churches all the way down to the local evangelistic churches, have been reluctant to engage in evangelism as a priority, (according to the Great Commission) they seem to me to be satisfied with their "wor-

ship” and content in the “love of Jesus” for them.

Rarely do you ever hear in a British church, songs of dedication, fighting to win the world, responsibility and dedication to God. No, this is quite rare today, they have become, to some degree at least, cocoons of self-absorption and self-comfort in their own cosy relationship with Jesus Christ. Of course, there is nothing wrong with that, but I am saying that can't be the majority focus of their sermons and their songs.

However, I will emphasise, that this is not necessarily the fault of all church members by any means. Generally speaking they are sheep and it is definitely the responsibility of church leaders to follow and implement the full Word of God. See Ezekiel 34 for a lot more detail on this.

### More notes about the young people

Over the last twenty years I have attended a few Church of England services in four or five different towns. Of course, this is generally traditional and a fixed way of “worshipping” God. But what I noticed in every single church I went into on a Sunday morning, that on the back rows there were always three or four young men, that is men in their twenties or even early thirties. You could see these men were in general poorer, and who had obviously, from looking in their faces, gone through either drugs, alcohol, various women or failed relationship(s) and had come out of it all looking for Truth. God had put into their hearts to look for Truth the only way and in the only place that they were probably aware of. I found this experience very encouraging. That despite so little Word of God coming from the pulpit of some churches, there was at least some Word of God in those “high” churches, there were also in those high churches some divinely inspired songs from across the

ages still well able to reach into their hearts and minds.



We've all seen flowers and plants growing through the cracks of concrete in cities or elsewhere, where no other foliage was around. As long as there is the Incorruptible Seed being given out, and as long as God is real, He will water it and supply the sunshine, and new life will always spring up!

*Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever. –1 Peter 1:23*

If these young tattooed and formerly drugged out young men and some women can start to come into saving Grace, how much more could be done among the other British youth if only **you** would wake up and simply give them the Incorruptible Seed of the Word of God, then God will do the rest. Unfortunately, I have found some British Christians are not willing to do it or not aware you should do that. <https://bit.ly/2lBozyJ>

➤ 3. So along with praying for the youth of this country, you could also ask God for a plan to reach them, the children and teens, with the Word of God, and then, implement the plan, even if it is just you, one person. If you are a church, pray for your plan to succeed as you give out the Incorruptible Seed. We need a lot more of the Incorruptible Seed going out in this land!

I feel many Christians do not understand several things about sharing their faith with others. Let me share with you some of the key points in a nutshell:

a. We are just delivery boys and girls. We are Ambassadors, to say it in a greater way. But the principle is the same- we are supposed to deliver the Word of God, the Incorruptible Seed to nations and individuals. We can do this either orally or via written words, like sharing a tract, offering someone a portion of, or, the whole Bible. We can do it by radio, tv, internet, songs, or any other methods.

b. Once we have done that, passed on the Word of God, (not just, or only, being a ‘nice’ person) then technically in God's eyes, as simple as it sounds, our job of delivery is finished. This is the truth of the parable of the sower. (see Matthew 13:3, Mark 4:3 and Luke 8:5). We are the sowers not the seed. Life is in the Seed not in the Sower. We only have to deliver the seed.

c. People (and nations) are then absolutely accountable to decide what they are going to do with the Seed. That's not our job. They then, before God, decide what they will receive from God.

d. Finally, some Christians, especially in the UK, seem to have this strange idea that we should not be so “in people's faces with the message” or even Jesus. I know one young man in England who has a sincere love for Jesus but refuses to give tracts. He rather prefers to offer cakes and sweets to passers-by. I can see his point, but unless you are actively giving the Word of God and holding forth, not **only** sweets, but also along with this the Word of God, then you won't be bearing much fruit. This is totally unscriptural.

We can see the message of Jesus brought division and there are so many hundreds of examples of people being offended by God's messengers in the entire Bible and across church history. If people need to be offended by Jesus or the Gospel, then they should be.

We should not hold back as Jesus said: "Blessed is he whosever is not offended in me."

*And blessed is he, whosoever shall not be offended in me.*

–Matthew 11:6

*And blessed is he, whosoever shall not be offended in me.*

–Luke 7:23

In regard to all these simple points above, why not become like the great previously and usually unknown Australian, Frank Jenner, who made a vow to the Lord after his Salvation. He promised God to give 10 Gospel tracts a day to people in his neighbourhood for as long as he lived or was physically able to do so. ➤ 4. Pray for God to help you understand that the future of the church in the United Kingdom (your country) may be a persecuted future in far stronger ways than we see today. Today we only see the handwriting on the wall. Just as the Jewish people and others saw this handwriting in 1930's Germany, prompting many to flee the country.

I am not saying you should do that, although this is a possibility, but you should be aware that the time from the "handwriting on the wall", which we already see in the United Kingdom of persecution of Christians, to the time when the fiercest, strongest and most violent persecution will become inescapable possibly for all, - well that time period might only be a few years difference.

I urge you to think and pray and adopt strategies as a church, network or even as a family and an individual about what your responses are and could be in such a case. Please feel free to contact me for further thoughts and sug-

gestions about this probability.

➤ 5. Have contingency plans as an individual, family and church. Yes, I do think that you should put the brake on your lives for a few days and think and pray about these points. What would you do in the event of a terrorist attack in your city? What about drought? How about the breakdown of law and order? What if supermarkets should run short of food and deliveries of fuel to petrol stations should dramatically decrease? The total elimination of your bank account(s) details due to a cyber-attack or systems failure?



The rise of a 'Health Passport', restricting your travel and movements? All this is highly possible, and I suggest you could pray about it and counsel with your family and church or fellowship and decide what could be the right plans and responses for you all. Oh, how good and how pleasant it is for the brethren to dwell together in unity.

–Psalm 133.

Applying this iconic Psalm to this scenario, we could say it is the responsibility of the church or fellowship leadership to pray together and then counsel with their flock in detail how to survive these various or other situations, and to implement some detailed plans in case of such events, for they will definitely come.

➤ 6. Have the attitude of the young woman who washed Jesus' feet with her tears and anointed them with oil inside the Pharisee's house. Ladies, (and Gentlemen) Make this lovely woman your role model. Could you do that? Would you sincerely show that kind of

love to Jesus Christ in spite of those around you, even other professing believers, should the situation arise? If the answer is no or you're not sure, then the best thing would be to pray for that inward change and make that kind of person your role model, by the grace of God.

*36And one of the Pharisees desired him that he would eat with him. And he went into the Pharisee's house, and sat down to meat.*

*37And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that Jesus sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment,*

*38And stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment.*

*39Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spake within himself, saying, This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner.*

*40And Jesus answering said unto him, Simon, I have somewhat to say unto thee. And he saith, Master, say on.*

*41There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty.*

*42And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most?*

*43Simon answered and said, I suppose that he, to whom he forgave most. And he said unto him, Thou hast rightly judged.*

*44And he turned to the woman, and said unto Simon, Seest thou this woman? I entered into thine house, thou gavest me no water for my feet: but she hath washed*

*my feet with tears, and wiped them with the hairs of her head.*

*45Thou gavest me no kiss: but this woman since the time I came in hath not ceased to kiss my feet.*

*46My head with oil thou didst not anoint: but this woman hath anointed my feet with ointment.*

*47Wherefore I say unto thee, Her sins, which are many, are forgiven; for she loved much: but to whom little is forgiven, the same loveth little.*

*48And he said unto her, Thy sins are forgiven.*

*49And they that sat at meat with him began to say within themselves, Who is this that forgiveth sins also?*

*50 And he said to the woman, Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace. –Luke 7:36-50*

## **7. Be prepared to die. (For Jesus).**

I remember a time when I sadly realised I was not ready to die for Jesus.

It was shocking to me. I felt ashamed, when I realised what a coward I was. My wife and I were visiting some colleagues in Jakarta, Indonesia. We had already been in China for some years and were on a short break there. The house of our friends backed on to the property of a Muslim Mosque. Since our colleagues had lived there many years, they had established good relations with their entire neighbourhood.

This time we stayed with them was about a year after the 'Bali Bombings' of 2002, an attack by militant Jihadists on foreigners at the popular resort of Bali, Indonesia.

So, it was Friday evening, Mosque time. The Muslim prop-

erty and ours were separated by a wall. Somewhere around 7 pm the celebrations or worship began. I didn't pay much attention to it. It was a mixture of people praying or listening or being quiet to other types of what to me seemed like chanting.

It went on and by going to bed, it was still very noisy. I remember I began to be quite fearful around 9 pm and the thought entered my mind (from the devil obviously); "Well these guys sound even more agitated and louder than before, and they don't seem to be interested in stopping any time soon". I thought: "Maybe they are aware we are mostly white foreigners here and are upset and going to do something to us!"

I tried to sleep, even much later the noises from over the wall came louder and louder it seemed. I went to sleep, I woke up. I didn't know what time it was. I just began envisioning these hordes of Muslims coming over the wall with Machetes swooping into our poorly defended property. Dying seemed like it was fixed on the menu for tonight, at least to me. I couldn't remember ever being so terrified in my whole life! Why was I not able to trust the Lord?

I got up and went to see the pastor of the place where we were. Perhaps it was around midnight. I even had to wake up the poor man and explain my worries to him. He put my mind at ease. Reassuring me it was common for the Friday nights to go on like this! Ha! We prayed together. I went back to bed and finally sleep. Sure enough, morning dawned, and we were all still in the land of the living!

What a complete idiot I felt. More than that however I felt ashamed. Ashamed of my weak faith and my unprepared heart and mind. I began to search my own mind and

heart as to why? Why was I even afraid, when I knew Jesus? Why could I not go the final step and be martyred in joy and happiness if this was necessary?

For some considerable time after this I searched my heart and prayed about this milestone experience. Since then I have studied about death (and eternal life) and a few Christian books on the subject as well as looking much closer in the Bible.

I trust now that if God should ever send me the real deal I hope and pray I will receive it with grace and love if that would be his plan for me.

Perhaps you feel all this is exaggerated. But perhaps you should pray about it too, because when you are "at ease in Zion", you really can't see much clearly and like many people have a false sense of security! Attacks on churches and Christians worldwide are at their highest nearly in all history. If certain people could get away with it here in the UK, they would try to kill us all.



Things may seem peaceful to you today; perhaps you are pottering about in your garden in summertime England, like dear Mrs Silva from Edmonton in North London when a mentally ill man came in from nowhere and beheaded her in her own garden in September 2014.

Stephen Farrow stabbed to death the Rev John Suddards, 59, in Thornbury, near Bristol, as well as Mrs. Betty Yates, 77, at her home, in Bewdley, Worcestershire in 2012.

Fusilier Lee Rigby was just walking fairly casually when he was destroyed in Woolwich on that fine sunny day in June 2013, and the list truly goes on and on and on. Some of it religious persecution, others just because you are white. His killers Adebolajo and Adebowale are British of Nigerian descent, were raised as Christians, and converted to Islam.

Dear Christopher Gray, who was only 32 years old and was the vicar of St Margaret's Church in Anfield, Liverpool was stabbed to death in his church grounds in 1996 late one night.

The wife of murdered parish priest Father Paul Bennett bravely tried to fight off her husband's attacker. (2007)

The father-of-two and grandfather-of-one died on the gravel path leading up to the door in the vicarage ground at St Fagan's Church, Trecynon, Aberdare, after being stabbed several times in the head and chest.

Local lay preacher Mark Williamson-Price, 39, said: "Paul opened the door at the vicarage and was confronted by a man who carried out a frenzied attack."

I encourage you to get alone with God and ask him to keep you from the evil in this country, and that you only die or be martyred, if it is truly His will for you.

*Woe to them that are at ease in Zion, and trust in the mountain of Samaria. –Amos 6:1a*

8. Further, along with praying for all the previous things, we are definitely going to need to pray for God to raise up people like Daniel, Joseph, Nehemiah and even Elijah to influence this nation at its highest levels.

The Luciferian World Order can



be minimised through prayer and also by God using totally fearless men and women in high places, even if they have to spill their blood for it. Let's pray God will raise them up in the coming days, so it will do this country a lot of good and enable some of the message to go out to those who may not otherwise hear it quite so clearly.

9. Together with this point; The church and missions in this country are also going to need finances. I believe we should pray now that God will also raise up sponsors for his work who have the abundance and heart to give to his children. This is often one of the greatest needs of Christian work and frequently its biggest lack. Prayer can definitely change things.

10. Why not go abroad as missionaries yourselves? The UK (your country?) has always been a good base for mission work. (?)

Why did God make it so that the UK was divided by that tiny stretch of water from the rest of Europe? The answer is clear and obvious- he had a special purpose. The UK (Your country) is like a greenhouse or incubator of great missionaries!

If you are finding it spiritually difficult in the UK, and you have a burden to win souls to Christ, why not also lift up your (own) eyes and look on the fields of the world some of which are still white to the harvest and open to the Gospel?

Whether you are young or old or in between, the Lord can use

you in his chosen field for you. You would be amazed. If, like me, you find little respect for men and women of God here, (Your country) or the local populace is not lining up at your door to come to your Tuesday night Bible study, there are other options for you.

You only have one life. Don't underestimate how God can use you whatever your age, even if you are in the twilight of your life or so you think, you can be heroes to some people in the right location, with some training and preparation. Get ready today. Who will go?

*Also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us? Then said I, here am I; send me. –Isaiah 6:8*

If you are young, and the Lord has not plugged or called you specifically into a ministry here, ask Him if he doesn't have a land over the horizon where you can burn bright for him, even with a small family, or as a single. God will show you if you ask Him.

*Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest. –John 4:35*

Before closing, I'd like to share this story which for some reason has come to me, and I believe the Lord wants me to include this. Once again, in today's world it's just so un-politically correct, thank God. I'll pass on this story and then hopefully in my limited wisdom try to share how it applies to this book, and how we can use it in so many situations in our lives.

### **"COME UP TO THE AVERAGE"**

His job was to help the (primarily) white gentlemen or white ladies with their journey, help with carrying their cases, do other small or menial jobs, advise on how the train was on schedule and so on. At the end of the line, it was the custom for the passengers to tip the porter.

Upon arrival, one white gentleman who had not travelled that route before, reached for his wallet in his top inside coat pocket. As he was bringing it out, he asked the porter: "How much is the average tip I should give"? The porter answered with no hesitation; "About five dollars, sah."

The gentleman shuffled through some dollar notes and pulled out the five dollars note and gave it to the porter, after which he said; "Is that the right amount, it seems a bit steep to be the average?"

The porter replied; "Yes that's right, sah, but you's the first one what's come up to the average so far!"

Even though no one had made the average so far, he lived in hope that one day, the average in his mind, would be there.

(This would be the spending the equivalent of US\$ 135 today)

Would you give a tip of US\$ 135 or about £102 today in the UK? Do you even or ever give that much to your church or missions?

**God is like this wonderful African-American gentleman who is telling us the average spiritual requirements are a lot higher than what you and I are normally prepared to give. That's a shame because the "average" would accomplish so much more. Why not ask God what His average is for you?**

Could it be an increase in your giving or tithing and setting aside each week as God has prospered you for missions or local outreach? Could it be an increase in

prayer, an increase in your hunger for the Word of God and an increase in your dedication of your own heart for the things and ways of God?



This dear old man had a clear vision what his standard should be! God has a clear idea in the Bible of what the average is for us, as Christians. He loves us deeply. We are so precious to him. We are a holy nation a peculiar and a special people, but so many of us may be looking the wrong way to find God's average. We are often looking at what we want to do and not the five dollars God may be asking for. I hope you "get it", and I hope I also "get it".

The standard for us is the Word of God. The standard really is to follow the example of those who have gone before us and lived dedicated lives for God. If no one else is doing it, then they have not come up to the genuine standard yet.

This should not stop us from obeying the Word of God and like Jesus said, *Blessed are they that hear the Word of God and do it.*

—Luke 11:28 or in other words hear the Word of God and "come up to the average".

Sometimes when I live or pass through this country of the UK for a short while, I find it a deceiving place; there seem to be so many

ways to look at this nation, so many good things and some bad. But really, what is the average, both in the people and in the Christians here?

The average is to always find what we should be doing and saying. Anything else is not the average and doesn't come up to the average. So always find out or ask God in your situation what is the average behaviour, what is the best standard and try and hit that, and even if no one else does it, that's no reason why you shouldn't "come up to the average" found in the Word of God yourself. And if you are a Christian, God will hold you accountable for that.
