So we are not doing a quiz about a person as we have normally done before, but **we are looking at the actual message from God here, and as there are 40 verses in this awesome Psalm**, we are going to be doing a few crazy questions after every ten verses! **Please read ten verses and then get ready for questions based on them. So get ready, here we go!**

Psalm 37

A Psalm of David.

¹ Do not fret because of those who are evil

or be envious of those who do wrong;

² for like the grass they will soon wither,

like green plants they will soon die away.

³ Trust in the LORD and do good; dwell in the land and enjoy safe pasture.

⁴ Take delight in the LORD, and he will give you the desires of your heart.

⁵ Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him and he will do this:

⁶ He will make your righteous reward shine like the dawn, your vindication like the noonday sun.

⁷ Be still before the LORD and wait patiently for him; do not fret when people succeed in their ways, when they carry out their wicked schemes.

⁸ Refrain from anger and turn from wrath; do not fret—it leads only to evil.

⁹ For those who are evil will be destroyed, but those who hope in the LORD will inherit the land.

¹⁰ A little while, and the wicked will be no more; though you look for them, they will not be found.

¹⁶ Better the little that the
righteous have
than the wealth of many
wicked;

¹⁷ for the power of the wicked will
be broken,
but the LORD upholds the
righteous.

¹⁸ The blameless spend their days
under the LORD's care,
and their inheritance will endure
forever.

¹⁹ In times of disaster they will not
wither;
in days of famine they will enjoy
plenty.

²⁰ But the wicked will perish:
Though the LORD's enemies are
like the flowers of the field,
they will be consumed, they will
go up in smoke.

righteous forsaken
or their children begging bread.

²⁶ They are always generous and
lend freely;
their children will be a blessing.

²⁷ Turn from evil and do good;
then you will dwell in the land
forever.

²⁸ For the LORD loves the just
and will not forsake his faithful
ones.

Wrongdoers will be completely
destroyed^[c];

the offspring of the wicked will
perish.

²⁹ The righteous will inherit the

land
and dwell in it forever.

³⁰ The mouths of the righteous
utter wisdom,
and their tongues speak what
is just.

³⁴ Hope in the LORD
and keep his way.
He will exalt you to inherit the
land;
when the wicked are
destroyed, you will see it.
³⁵ I have seen a wicked and
ruthless man
flourishing like a luxuriant
native tree,
³⁶ but he soon passed away and
was no more;
though I looked for him, he
could not be found.
³⁷ Consider the
blameless, observe the upright;
a future awaits those who seek
peace^d
³⁸ But all sinners will be destroyed;
there will be no future^[a] for the
wicked.
³⁹ The salvation of the righteous
comes from the LORD;
he is their stronghold in time of
trouble.
⁴⁰ The LORD helps them and
delivers them;
he delivers them from the
wicked and saves them,
because they take refuge in
him.
