NATIONS PART I

Isaiah 40: 15 Behold, the nations are like a drop from a bucket and are counted as small dust on the scales; behold, He takes up the isles like a very little thing.

WARM GREETINGS!

For at least a year it has been in my mind to write a series of articles about the topic of 'Nations'. This could include a great deal of fascinating information and scripture too.

In this introductory part, I am going to share scripture about what the Bible actually says about 'Nations' from both the Lord's and man's perspective. In this series, I will be using a mix of the King James Translation and the Amplified Classic Translation.

- If we do go further, we may cover topics such as the rise and fall of nations and specific nations. We hopefully and eventually may talk about the possible destruction of America, Israel and the possible overthrow of specific western Nations, notably, France, England and Germany among others.

So let's kick off with God's good Word!

How does God view Nations? A basic overview.

First we need to understand God's perspective about the nations He views from Heaven. The leading verse above is excellent and so is this one in the same chapter: 17 All the nations are as nothing before Him; they are regarded by Him as less than nothing and

emptiness (waste, futility, and worthlessness).

Now that is shocking isn't it? In this modern age, when being patriotic, nationalistic and very proud of 'where you come from', really rules in the minds of the world. Yet here we see God has the opposite view.

God sees nothing but the blood-washed soul, and all those souls, washed in the blood of Jesus Christ, from whatever nation they come from, they make up a completely new nation, the nation of God's people. So it's not surprising that the devil would like to instil in us another doctrine or belief system, especially today. And we can prove this via this great verse:

1 Peter 2:9-10

9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a dedicated (holy)nation, [God's] own purchased, special people, that you may set forth the wonderful deeds and display the virtues and perfections of Him Who called you out of darkness into His marvellous light.

10 Once you were not a people [at all], but now you are God's people; once you were unpitied, but now you are pitied and have received mercy.

So, in summary for this intro, we clearly see two important points: The first is that 'Nations' initially grew out of small families, then clans, and eventually nation units or nation states.

Secondly, at the same time today, The Lord ONLY sees His people and His children who love Jesus Christ and are born again. This is the only legitimate nation in the eyes of God today.

How human nations grew:

Nations began after the fall of man and especially after the Flood. We read the generations of Noah's three sons and their genealogies and we discover that each one went to a different part of the earth and populated it via their progeny and that is how nations began. The dividing of languages at the Tower of Babel (Confusion) introduced more nations who spoke a common language. These common language groups grew exponentially and headed in different directions, both after the Flood and then again after the Time Period of the Tower of Babel.

I highly recommend anyone more interested to read Genesis chapter 10.

Finally I have pasted in the first results of my search about: how did nations form after the fall of man

Based on biblical accounts, nations formed after the "Fall of Man" (the fall in Eden) primarily through the scattering of humanity after the Flood, specifically via the family of Noah, which culmi-



nated in the division of languages at the Tower of Babel. According to the Genesis “Table of Nations” (**Genesis 10**), 70 distinct nations emerged from Noah’s three sons—Shem, Ham, and Japheth—representing a division based on language, clan, and territory.

The Process of Nation Formation Post-Flood Repopulation (Genesis 10):

Following the Flood, Noah’s descendants began to fill the earth. Genesis identifies 70 specific familial lines (26 from Shem, 30 from Ham, and 14 from Japheth) that became the progenitors of ancient ethnic and cultural

the sons of Japheth settled toward Europe, Ham toward Africa, and Shem in Western Asia).

Development of Tribal Structures: Over time, these groups banded together for survival, developed agricultural practices, and eventually transitioned into kingdoms or nations.

Key Genealogical Groups

Japheth’s Descendants: Traditionally associated with the Indo-European peoples, settling toward the North and West.

Ham’s Descendants: Often associated with civilizations in Africa and parts of the Middle East (such as Cush, Mizraim, and Canaan).

The Babel Dispersion (Genesis 11):

Initially, humanity lived together with one language. When they attempted to build a tower to heaven in rebellion against God, their language was confused, forcing them to break into distinct linguistic groups. This supernatural scattering forced isolation and led to the creation of different languages and cultures.

Migration and Settlement: These separated language groups migrated away from Mesopotamia, settling in different regions and forming their own nations, often described in familial terms (e.g.,

Shem’s Descendants: Progenitors of Semitic peoples, including the Hebrews, Arabs, and Assyrians, often associated with Western Asia. These nations grew and interacted over time, often establishing borders as tribal groups expanded. This biblical account suggests that the variety of nations, languages, and cultures was not part of the initial creation but a consequence of the post-flood, post-Babel era.

Other interesting thoughts and scriptures about Nations:

God is aware we have nations! He has always dealt with nations on a national level. Here are some fascinating verses about this.

Job 12: 23 He makes nations great, and He destroys them;

He enlarges nations [and then straitens and shrinks them again], and leads them [away captive].

Isaiah 40: 16 And Lebanon is not sufficient to burn, nor the beasts thereof sufficient for a burnt offering.

17 All nations before him are as nothing; and they are counted to him less than nothing, and vanity. Job 12: 20 He removeth away the speech of the trusty, and taketh away the understanding of the aged.

21 He poureth contempt upon princes, and weakeneth the strength of the mighty.

22 He discovereth deep things out of darkness, and bringeth out to light the shadow of death.

23 He increaseth the nations, and destroyeth them: he enlargeth the nations, and straiteneth them again.

24 He taketh away the heart of the chief of the people of the earth, and causeth them to wander in a wilderness where there is no way.

25 They grope in the dark without light, and he maketh them to stagger like a drunken man.

The Apostle Paul preached in Athens before Areopagus:

Acts 17:24 God that made the world and all things therein, seeing that he is Lord of heaven and earth, dwelleth not in temples made with hands;

25 Neither is worshipped with men’s hands, as though he needed any thing, seeing he giveth to all life, and breath, and all things; 26 And hath made of one blood all nations of men for to dwell on all the face of the earth, and hath determined the times before appointed, and the bounds of their habitation;

27 That they should seek the Lord, if haply they might feel after him, and find him, though he be not far from every one of us:

28 For in him we live, and move, and have our being; as certain also of your own poets have said,

For we are also his offspring. Now verse 26 above is a really key verse about nations. Possibly I feel the most important verse in the Bible about 'Nations'.

It is GOD who has done three things in establishing nations:

firstly, He has made them all of one blood, human blood, secondly He has specifically allotted to each nation its own boundaries or borders, this is quite amazing, and countries primarily today, albeit with some important corrupt changes or modifications of man, and finally, He has in some general way, appointed a time frame for those nations to exist.

The reason for some nations not to exist today can be many, including disobedience or rebellion to God's message, other warring tribes overthrowing them, famine and forced ethnic cleansing and exile of the original population. There may be many more, everything is allowed by the Lord ultimately.

Proverbs 14:34 Righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people. Here is a verse which is uniform across the world. That if your nation is righteous and embraces Christ for the most part, your nation will be lifted up, and the reverse is also true, that as the population of your tribe continues in its sin, then you bear a reproach or a shame and even judgment. I hope I have not become too confusing!

God's original promise to Abraham was that his descendants would be nations and his seed, that is all who followed the same faith as Abraham would be blessed across the earth and throughout history.

Today we fully understand that the promises of God to Abraham are specifically referring to a belief in Jesus Christ.

Jesus said: Abraham rejoiced to see His day. Here it is in John 8: 55 Yet ye have not known him; but I know him: and if I should say, I know him not, I shall be a liar like unto you: but I know him, and keep his saying.

56 Your father Abraham rejoiced to see my day: and he saw it, and was glad.

57 Then said the Jews unto him, Thou art not yet fifty years old, and hast thou seen Abraham?

58 Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Before Abraham was, I am.

I hope you have enjoyed this basic introduction.

Don't forget to read Genesis 10, do a Bible search using the word 'Nations' and scroll through that! Look at the dreams and prophecies in the book of Daniel: Daniel 2 and 7 to see the rise and fall of the nations of: Babylon, Medo-Persia, Greece, Rome, and the final rise of the Antichrist Government.
