This edition is primarily about the first amazing time Jesus sends out his 70 disciples to preach the Gospel. A similar message is in Matthew chapter 10, but this only speaks about the 12 Apostles being sent and specific advice for them from the Lord.

The Seventy Sent Out

Luke chapter 10

After these things the Lord appointed seventy others also, and sent them two by two before His face into every city and place where He Himself was about to go.

²Then He said to them, "The harvest truly is great, but the labourers are few; therefore pray

the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into His harvest.

³Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs among wolves.

⁴Carry neither money bag, knapsack, nor sandals; and greet no one along the road.

⁵But whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house.'

⁶And if a son of peace is there, your peace will rest on it; if not, it will return to you.

⁷And remain in the same house, eating and drinking such things as they give, for the labourer is worthy of his wages. Do not go from house to house.

⁸Whatever city you enter, and they receive you, eat such things as are set before you.

⁹And heal the sick there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'

¹⁰But whatever city you enter, and they do not receive you, go out into its streets and say,

¹¹'The very dust of your city which clings to ^[b]us we wipe off against you. Nevertheless know this, that the kingdom of God has come near you.'

¹²But I say to you that it will be more tolerable in that Day for Sodom than for that city.

QUESTIONS ON VERSES 1-12

1. How many disciples and apostles did the Lord have at

Woe to the Impenitent Cities (unrepentant cities)

¹³ "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works which were done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago, sitting in sackcloth and ashes. (five cities in these verses, note from WCF staff)

¹⁴ But it will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment than for you.

¹⁵ And you, Capernaum, who are exalted to heaven, will be brought down to Hades.

¹⁶ He who hears you hears Me, he who rejects you rejects Me, and he who rejects Me rejects Him who sent Me."
